First Aid Facilities	Normal washroom facilities.

SECTION 5 – FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

Occupational Release	Minor spills do not normally need any special clean-up measures. In the event of a major spill, prevent spillage from entering drains or water courses. Wear protective equipment to prevent skin and eye contact. Cover with absorbent (inert material, sand or soil). Sweep or vacuum up, but avoid generating dust. Collect and seal in properly labelled containers or drums for disposal. Wash area down with excess water.
